Read this **BEFORE** voting in Colorado's judicial retention elections.

WARNING!

Following the recommendation of any judicial performance commission is **DANGEROUS**.

Colorado's judicial performance commissions:

- Do NOT know whether the judges they're evaluating have been disciplined;
- Do NOT know how many complaints have been filed against any judge;
- Do **NOT** know the contents of complaints filed against any judge;
- Do **NOT** know whether any judge's financial disclosures are accurate;
- Do NOT know whether any judge has acted on a conflict of interest;
- Do **NOT** know whether any judge is in compliance with the law; and
- Do **NOT** know whether any judge has a DUI or misdemeanor conviction.

Colorado's Open Records Act does NOT apply to judges.

Colorado's judicial performance commissions:

- Do NOT hold hearings where they listen to complaints about judges;
- Lack historical information regarding judges;
- Rely heavily on information provided by the judge under review; and
- Have insufficient credible information about the judges they evaluate.

Colorado's judicial system actively hides information about judges from you.

Colorado state court judges are appointed in darkness, disciplined in darkness and retained in darkness.
